## NURSE'S STATION



### Important Information from your School Nurse:

Every year you are inundated with forms when your child starts a new school year. One of the most important forms that your child will bring home year after year is the emergency form. And although you have already completed and sent this in for your child, it is important that you all understand the significance of this form to the school nurse.


The emergency forms are the very best link between the school and home. When a child needs to be dismissed because of illness or injury, the parents are called at home, at work, or on the cell, so having these phone numbers is critical. In addition, if we cannot reach the parents, it is imperative that there are other numbers of relatives, friends or neighbors that you would trust to pick your child up. In many cases, some forms have only the home phone number listed. In some cases, phone numbers have been disconnected or changed, and no new numbers are forwarded to the school.

The forms are also signed by parents so that in an extreme emergency, one in which your child needed to be transported to the area hospital, a copy of the form goes along with your child so that the EMT's and hospital staff have authorization to care for your child. In addition, the nurse looks at each form carefully and reads and records any pertinent health or allergy information that you have included on the form. These forms are very important to us!

Your child's emergency form should be current at all times, and should never be lacking any important information. Additionally, it should be changed when phone numbers or addresses change. The number one goal of any school nurse is to take great care of the kids, and keep the parents informed of your child's health and well being while at school. Please help us with this by ensuring that your child always has a current emergency forms with many phone numbers and emergency contacts in place! Thank you!
